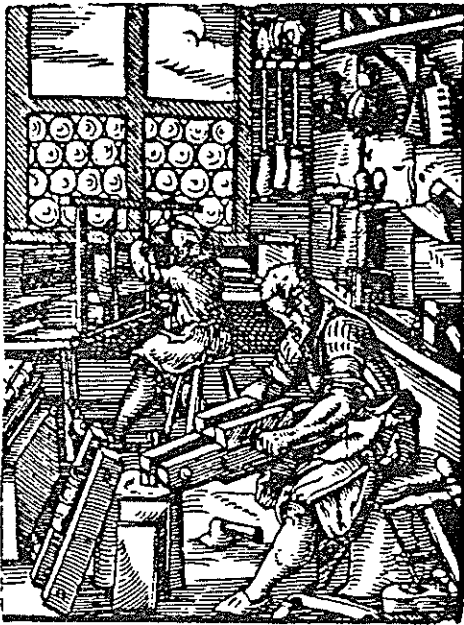

It is intended for librarians, curators, archivists and others responsible for preservation of collections. Topics include strategies for dealing with emergencies; disaster plans; resources to tap in case of emergencies; and training staff for disaster response. The presenters are Susan Swartzburg, Preservation Specialist, Rutgers University Libraries, and SCILS Visiting Lecturer; and Evelyn Frangakis, Project Director, NY State Conservation Consultancy. Registration is limited to 30. Fee of \$45 includes break, lunch, and handouts. Participants will be awarded .5 CEUs, which may be applied toward the PDS Certificate in Preservation. Registration deadline is Oct. 2.
